"A Palestinian Child Dies in Yarmouk due to the Lack of Medical Care Because of the Siege"

Victims

The 10-year- child "Nidal Murad" died in the besieged Yarmouk refugee camp due to cardiac arrest because of not receiving the necessary treatment for meningitis and septicemia after all hospitals and clinics stopped working due to the strict siege imposed by the regular army and PFGC. The toll of the siege victims reached to 184 refugees who died due to malnutrition and medical care shortage in the besieged camp.



Recent Updates

Syrian security services continue detaining the family of "Mawloud Khaled Al-Abdullah," and reticent about the fate of all members, while they were arrested on 27.07.2013 at Nesreen Street in Al Tadamon neighborhood adjacent to the Yarmouk camp. They are:

Father "Mawloud Khaled Al-Abdullah" 73-year-old, heart patient

Mother" Thiba Al-Ahmad "65 years, diabetes patient

Ilham Mawloud al-Abdullah, 48 years, Enam Mawloud al-Abdullah 33 years, Jasmine Mawloud al-Abdullah, 39 years, and her son Ubada Abdullah 6 years.



Unconfirmed news reported that the families that have been arrested from Al Tadamon neighborhood are held by one of the Syrian regime popular Committees; other news reported that they are held in a Syrian security branch in Damascus, while the fate of those families are not known yet.

On the other hand, people of Al Aedein camp in Homs organized, the day before yesterday, a solidarity march for Al-Aqsa Mosque, and in support of the Palestinian uprising. The march roamed the streets of the camp, while the demonstrators denounced the international, the Arab, and the Muslim silence towards the ongoing violations against Al-Aqsa Mosque and Islamic holy sites in the occupied Palestine, and attempts to seizing, dividing, and imposing control.

Demonstrators raised slogans condemning violations and practices of the occupation forces against Al-Aqsa Mosque.



The displaced Palestinian refugees are suffering from multiple economic crises, most notably the high rents of houses between \$ 150 and \$ 350, in addition to the high rate of unemployment, where most refugees have lost their jobs because of war.



It is referred that Al Zahira, Al Maydan, Jaramana, Qudseia, and Khan Dannon compare the most areas that receiving Palestinian refugees who fled to escape shelling, clashes, and siege imposed on their camps.

Civil Work Committees

Palestinians of Syria Committee in Lebanon provided two nebulization devices the day before yesterday, for two displaced Palestinian Syrian children suffer from asthma at Al Burj Al Shamali camp in Tyre city South Lebanon.

The Student Committee of the Palestinians of Syria Committee in Lebanon ended the distribution of 2,000 school bags and stationery to the Palestinians and Syrians students in the five areas in Lebanon, "Beirut, Tripoli, Beqaa, Sidon, and Tyre.

It is worth mentioning that Palestinians of Syria Committee in Lebanon is a civil Committee that serves the Palestinian refugees coming from the Syrian camps to Lebanon and aims to shed light on their suffering and tragedy, and to extend a helping hand to them.

Numbers and Statistics till 6/11/2015

- *15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.*
- *At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.*

- *The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 858 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 928 days, water was cut for 418 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 182 victims.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 719 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - Residents have left the camp for 920 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 564 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jarmana, AL Saieda Zainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Shieh road.*
